

BUSINESS OVERVIEW

Dan Inman Electric has been serving the electrical needs of the Athens community since 1972. The business began also offering heating, cooling and generator services in the early 80's.

A LONG HISTORY

The business was established when Dan was looking to make some additional money after work and on the weekends (1972), and he was self employed and didn't hire any additional staff until 1976. The staff grew to include up to 8 professional electricians, HVAC installers, and technicians. In early 2009, Dan approached me about moving to Athens to begin to learn about the business. My family and I relocated to Athens in August of 2009 and Dan retired in 2015. We currently have 5 employees but we would love to hire an additional electrician if anyone is looking for a job!

SECRETS TO SUCCESS

I believe that the secret to success is the relationships that my staff and I have with our customers, and our attention to detail.

WHAT TO KNOW

Our services include generator sales/ service and duct cleaning, in addition to the HVAC and electrical needs we are already well known for.
