# Advocating for Business Incubators

At the **Ohio University Innovation Center** on Wednesday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, Chamber President Dani Underhill took part in a roundtable discussion with Ohio Lieutenant Governor Jon Husted, Ohio Department of Development Director Lydia Mihalik, Governor's Office of Appalachia Director John Carey, strategic partners in the local economic ecosystem, and local technology companies. The group discussed the state's efforts to support the economy and the challenges that business incubators face, as well as strategies for raising capital. Local incubators also explained the myriad reasons that they chose to base their companies in Athens, including the affordable and attractive culture and community and the supportive network that Athens has built to connect businesses to services and capital.

# Promoting the Chamber on Air

On Wednesday, September 15<sup>th</sup>, Chamber President Dani Underhill was a guest on WATH's Party Line talk show - Ohio's longest continuously airing talk show. During the hour-long radio program, Underhill promoted the Chamber while talking with host Dave Palmer, and covered topics including Chamber member benefits, details of the Ambassador's club, and the history of the Athens Area Chamber of Commerce. #### Third Sun Solar Donates and Celebrates

Athen's **Third Sun Solar** is proud to announce the donation of a roof-mounted solar array to the Baileys Trail System project this winter.

Third Sun Solar's partnership with the Village of Chauncey and the Baileys Trail System will provide clean energy at the Chauncey-Dover Community Park trailhead. Third Sun Solar will install the solar system on the rooftop of the

restroom facility. The solar energy installation will begin in January of 2022. The addition of a solar array to the restroom facility will reduce the Village's utility costs for the next two decades or more.

Additionally, this June Third Sun Solar celebrated 21 years since its founding date in 2000, and on September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the company hosted its postponed 20th Anniversary Celebration and Open House for customers, partners, and supporters.
